

MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER
(To Elected Members and CEOs)

REGIONAL SUBSIDIARIES

As part of the transitional arrangements in the Local Government (Implementation) Act 1999, section 200 controlling authorities established under the 1934 Local Government Act and in existence at 31 December 1999 continued in existence as regional subsidiaries under the 1999 Local Government Act.

Section 25 of the Local Government (Implementation) Act 1999 also provided that the rules of the controlling authority will be taken to be the charter of the subsidiary, and that any non-compliance concerning the charter of the subsidiary with the requirements of Schedule 2 of the 1999 Act may be disregarded **until 1 January 2002**.

There have not been any new regional subsidiaries formed under the 1999 Act. All current regional subsidiaries, except Eastern Health Authority, appear to be operating under charters made as rules before commencement of the Local Government Act 1999. These charters need to be reviewed and any necessary changes made by the constituent councils before 1 January 2002. I also expect that the charter as amended should be provided to me and Gazetted by 1 January 2002.

I encourage all constituent councils to commence charter reviews as soon as possible to allow sufficient time to meet this deadline.

The Office of Local Government has prepared the attached list of known current regional subsidiaries and constituent councils for your information.

CURRENT REGIONAL SUBSIDIARIES

NOTE These regional subsidiaries are all former section 200 authorities. The rules made under section 200 of the 1934 Local Government Act are regarded as the charter of the regional subsidiary under the 1999 Local Government Act.

This charter must be updated by the constituent councils to comply with schedule 2 of the 1999 Local Government Act by **1 January 2002**.

A copy of the amended charter must be Gazetted and provided to the Minister for Local Government.
